Kent Tritle is one of America's leading choral conductors. Called "the brightest star in New York's choral music world" by *The New York Times*, he is in his fifth season as Director of Cathedral Music and Organist at the Cathedral of St. John the Divine in New York City; his ninth season as Music Director of Musica Sacra, the longest continuously performing professional chorus in New York; and his eleventh season as Music Director of the Oratorio Society of New York, the acclaimed 200-voice volunteer chorus. In addition, Kent is Director of Choral Activities at the Manhattan School of Music and is a member of the graduate faculty of The Juilliard School. Also an acclaimed organ virtuoso, Kent Tritle is the organist of the New York Philharmonic and the American Symphony Orchestra.

Please send a recording of a vocalization demonstrating the bottom to top of your range along with a 16 bar excerpt from recent repertoire you have performed. This can be with or without accompaniment, a solo piece, or your part in a choral work. Send by email to <code>info@amherstearlymusic.org</code> along with a short resume of your choral experience, and current choral affiliations. Include last 2-3 years of repertoire, major works, and early music that you have performed.
